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1. Why Malaga?

2.2 Facilities

Location:

Located in Pedregalejo, one of Malaga's privileged areas, well connected by public transport to the city centre and only 50 metres away from the beach.

Originally a fishing village, Pedregalejo was later annexed to the city of Malaga, though its past can still be seen in the many fishing boats and seafood restaurants which line the neighborhood's picturesque shoreline.

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3. The Courses

At Cervantes Escuela Internacional we offer different types of courses to suit the various needs of your clients.

All our Standard Courses have weekly start dates (for beginners 2 start dates per month), and offer flexible duration from 1 week onwards. We also offer other more specialised courses for students with specific needs or interests at different dates of the year.

3.1 Methodology

Our extensive professional experience has enabled us to develop a teaching system that combines the communicative method with the structured study of grammar, which is integrated in the communication itself.

This method is organised throughout the six levels (European Common Framework of Reference for Languages), to allow students to learn and perfect their language skills in a practical and enjoyable way depending on their needs. Through different types of activities students will work on their reading, listening, speaking and writing skills in order to achieve fluency in Spanish.

3.2 Levels

Our levels correlate to the Common European Framework of Reference for Language, which makes it easier for students to relate their level with other courses or requirements in their country of origin.

LEVEL GUIDE	
A1 (BEGINNER)	Students who have little or no knowledge of Spanish.
A2 (ELEMENTARY)	Students who can communicate in basic situations using the present, past and future tenses, but with some errors. They can understand Spanish when someone speaks slowly
B1 (INTERMEDIATE)	Students who feel secure speaking and writing in Spanish. They know quite a lot of vocabulary, but need to practise and expand their grammar knowledge.
B2 (UPPER INTERM.)	Students who can communicate fluently and with confidence in a wide range of situations but need a deeper study of grammar structures and learn more specific vocabulary.
C1 (ADVANCED) C2 (SUPERIOR)	Students with an excellent level of Spanish, able to communicate effectively as a native. They need to perfect the language to ensure its adequate cultural use by means of extensive study into the subtleties of the Spanish language.

3.3 Our Teachers

Our team of teachers has been carefully selected, according to their academic qualifications, experience and professionalism. All our teachers are native Spanish Speakers with degrees from the best universities and they regularly participate in practical courses on the art of teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language and the latest teaching methods so that they are always up to date.

They have not only been chosen for their qualifications and experience, but also for their ability to work enthusiastically with students. The teachers will help students to establish clear learning objectives and will encourage them to take part in the lessons in Spanish from the very first day. The lessons are stimulating and interesting.

The Head of Studies and her team will assess and carefully guide student's progress.

3.4 Teaching Materials

On their first day, students receive a text book that covers grammar, exercises, vocabulary, writing and conversation material. Our experienced team of teachers complement this with Cervantes Escuela Internacional's own teaching materials, special publications, internet articles and audio visual material to achieve a complete immersion in all aspects of the Spanish language.

- Long Term Spanish Courses:

Our Long Term courses are aimed at students with little or no knowledge of the Spanish language who wish to spend 3, 6 or 9 months in Spain. They will immerse themselves in the Spanish Culture and, depending on their starting level and length of course, move on to an Intermediate or Advanced level of Spanish during their stay.

Students can choose between a Standard, Standard Plus or Intensive Long Stay course and benefit from special long stay rates. They can also choose to stay for 1, 2 or 3 terms (3 months per term).

Our Long Term Spanish Courses include:

- Private Lessons:

- **Golden Age Course (50+):**

This programme is designed for people from 50 years of age and upwards who want to learn Spanish in a more relaxed atmosphere than that of the Intensive courses and discover Spanish and Andalusian culture first-hand (students younger than 50 years old but with the same objectives can also take part in this course).

This fun and friendly programme focuses on the practical use of the Spanish language in everyday situations. Each level has different goals. For those students with a basic level, lessons will focus on every day conversations in Spanish, such as ordering something at the bar or restaurant, shopping, booking a room in a hotel or asking information about a tourist destination. For advanced students, the goal will be to expand their knowledge about the Spanish culture and way of life, learning about Spanish civilization, Literature, History and Art.

This course also includes cultural activities during midday or the afternoon, for instance visits to museums, guided walking tours, flamenco shows, etc. At the weekend, students will enjoy 1 day excursions to other cities (eg: Seville, Cordoba, Granada, the white villages, etc.). Those who so wish, can even enjoy a weekend in Morocco (optional, not included in the price).

NOTE: Should there be no sufficient students of 50+ to run this level of course, students can join the Standard course of the appropriate level.

- **Standard + Flamenco Dance:**

This course combines the Standard Spanish course with a Flamenco Dance course in the afternoon.

While students are learning and perfecting the language in their Spanish lessons during the morning, they also have the opportunity to learn and develop the techniques of flamenco in the afternoon.

Flamenco dance lessons are taught by an experienced teacher, who specializes in these famous dances from the south of Spain. In many of the flamenco lessons, the students will have the opportunity to meet Spaniards who are also learning flamenco dance.

• D.E.L.E Preparation Course:

DELE stands for Diploma de Español como Lengua Extranjera, or "Diploma of Spanish as a Foreign Language". It is the only certificate for non-native Spanish speakers that is officially recognised by the Spanish Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport. It is of great international value for those who are going to study at a Spanish University or who want to work in a Spanish speaking environment.

Cervantes Escuela Internacional offers preparation courses for:

- Diploma de Español Nivel B1 (Beginner level): This qualification attests to sufficient linguistic ability for understanding and responding appropriately in most normal day-to-day situations and for expressing desires and needs in a basic way. (Minimum level B1)
- Diploma de Español Nivel B2 (Intermediate level): This qualification accredits sufficient linguistic ability to get by in average day-to-day situations in normal communication circumstances, which do not require specialized use of the language. (Minimum level B2)
- Diploma de Español Nivel C2 (Proficiency level): This qualification accredits the necessary linguistic competence to deal with situations requiring an advanced use of the language and knowledge of the cultural customs associated with it. (Minimum level C2)

Exam Dates for 2012 are:

- 25 - 26 May 2012 (exam enrolment: 27 Feb. - 20 April)
- 24 August 2012 (exam enrolment: 2 July - 27 July).
- 9 - 10 November 2012: (exam enrolment: 3 Sept. - 5 Oct.)

The success rate of our students at D.E.L.E exams is over 98%!

• **Spanish for the Legal Profession:**

The course is aimed at legal professionals in general, and, more specifically to Lawyer-Linguists, lawyers, judges and translators. We regularly receive students who work in the different institutions of the European Union.

The programme will allow students to understand legal texts and arguments, to draw up documents and to express themselves correctly using legal vocabulary, as well as to get acquainted with the Spanish Legal System and the Organisms and Institution that it comprises.

The Legal Spanish lessons are taught and coordinated by lawyers belonging to "Ilustre Colegio de Abogados de Málaga" (Malaga's Bar Association) so that the students can have access to their expert knowledge. Different types of support teaching materials are used: own teaching material, special publications, audio-visual documents and the internet.

• **Standard + Hispanic Studies:**

This course has been developed to give students the opportunity to learn Spanish at their own level by means of an interactive system, and combine their studies with a special course in History, Literature, Geography, Arts, current Spanish topics, etc. This will help students to approach and deepen their knowledge about the essential cultural aspects that form the real Hispanic world.

• **Courses for Teachers of Spanish as a Foreign Language:**

This course is aimed at non-native Spanish teachers who want to refresh, deepen and perfect their knowledge of the Spanish language. Participants will learn about the most popular and latest methods of Spanish teaching and the different didactic techniques available to aid them in their professional development.

Many of our course participants have obtained a Comenius or Grundtvig grant for the funding of their course and we are currently listed in the official Grundtvig course database.

4. Accommodation & Transfer

At Cervantes Escuela Internacional, we recognise that accommodation is a very important part of the student's experience during their stay. Therefore, we take special care in selecting the best possible accommodation to make sure students fully enjoy their stay.

- Accommodation is regularly assessed through periodic visits from school staff and student feedback both on the first and last week of stay
- Accommodation officer at school: one of our staff members is in charge of all accommodation matters and students can contact him if they have any queries or problems regarding their accommodation.
- Our goal is customer satisfaction. If a student wishes to change their accommodation once they are already at school, we can normally change them within 1 or 2 days. (If they wish to change to the residence, of course this depends on availability).
- All accommodation is close to the school (within a 20 minute walk) and to the beach.
- Several types of accommodation offered to cater for the needs and preferences of different types of students

Please note that accommodation is booked from the Sunday prior to the start of the course to the Saturday after the end of the course.

4.5 Airport Transfer

Cervantes Escuela Internacional also offers an option transfer service from Malaga Airport to the student's accommodation, either on arrival only or both ways.

This service can be booked together with the course. We will need to receive the arrival flight details at least one week before the student's arrival. The confirmation letter of the course will contain instructions for the student regarding the transfer as well as the driver's phone number.

Students making their own way to their accommodation:

Taxi:

Students can take a taxi at the airport and request to be taken directly to the host family or residence in Malaga. It will take about 30 minutes and will cost approximately € 25.

Students staying in an apartment need to go to Bar "Centro", Avenida Juan Sebastián Elcano, 129 to pick up the key.

Bus:

There is a new Express Bus Service from Malaga Airport to the Centre which operates from 06:25hrs to 24:00 hrs, and takes around 20 minutes to the Centre of Malaga (Alameda)

The bus nº 19 also operates from the airport to the centre of Malaga, which costs € 1,10. You have to get off at the stop in the "Paseo del Parque - Ayuntamiento". Then you have to look for the bus nº 11 which will bring you to Pedregalejo/El Palo.

Train:

The train from the airport to the city centre costs € 1,35 to € 1,50 and it takes about 15 minutes. Once arrived at the last stop you have to keep on walking for 2 minutes to the Alameda Principal and take the bus nº 11 to Pedregalejo/El Palo.

Students living in a Spanish family should take bus nº 11 to the nearest bus stop to their host family.

Students living in an apartment must pick up the keys at Bar "Centro", Avenida Juan Sebastián Elcano, 129 before going to the apartment. Take bus nº 11 until the "Arroyo Jaboneros" stop.

Students living at the residence we suggest that they take a taxi from the airport or from the bus stop of the bus nº 11 "Arroyo Jaboneros" in Pedregalejo.

Bus 34 from the centre brings you half way to the residence (get out at bus stop "San Isidro" and walk to the round about that you have passed with the bus and then straight on.

4.6 Medical Insurance

Cervantes Escuela Internacional can arrange medical insurance cover for students who so request it. This insurance covers medical consult, hospital admittance or medical surgery. Medicines other than the ones provided in hospital, and dental treatment are not covered.

In case of an emergency, students can go to the closest medical centre, after that the school will help them arrange the bureaucratic formalities.

Students from countries of the European Union that have reciprocal agreements with Spain, have the right to free medical treatment for which they will need to bring a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).

As is the case with any international trip, all students should be covered by medical insurance during their stay abroad, whether the one offered by Cervantes Escuela Internacional or any other insurance they choose.

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5. Activities & Excursions



At Cervantes Escuela Internacional we know that it is important to have a good programme of extra curricular activities for our students so that they can practice their Spanish outside of the classroom and socialize with each other whilst learning about Spanish culture, customs and sights.

Therefore, every week we offer a dynamic, lively and imaginative program of extracurricular activities and a weekend excursion, and we are also open to student's suggestions for new activities and excursion.

The weekly programme is posted every Monday on the activity board so that all the students can easily see what is on offer that week. This programme is coordinated by our activities manager and a school representative always accompanies the students during the activities. Students need to sign up for the activities they are interested in at reception by the date indicated on the programme.

The weekly programme includes:

- 1 activity every working day
- 1 cultural activity per week
- 1 excursion every weekend

Examples of leisure activities include:

- Malaga tour: Cultural visit of the town centre during which students will discover the different civilizations that have passed through Malaga and visit the most important monuments in the city. This activity enables students to get their bearings around the city, find out how to get around, and the opening hours of shops, banks, etc.
- Chocolate con churros: Typical Spanish snack in one of the most emblematic cafés in Malaga. Hot chocolate is delicious on its own, but add to it the magnificent churros and it becomes a delicacy.
- Cultural Talk: Malaga, history in its streets: Cultural and illustrated talk, with many images of the different civilizations that have passed through the city of Malaga, from the Phoenicians to the present day. Students will discover interesting facts about the capital of the Costa del Sol.
- Arab Culture Workshop: henna tattoo fun workshop focused on the culture that most influenced Spanish civilization. We will look at typical Muslim costumes, take photos of ourselves trying them on, make a temporary henna tattoo and learn how to prepare and enjoy mint tea.
- Spanish Cooking Class: Spanish style fiesta, with Spanish music, sangria tasting and preparation of some of the typical Spanish dishes: paella, Andalusian gazpacho, Spanish omelette, Malaga white garlic soup, fruit salad or Malaga salad, etc.
- Film Club: Alejandro Amenabar: Welcome to our own movie house, with popcorn and soda, where we spend a wonderful evening watching a Spanish movie with Spanish subtitles, by this great Spanish film director, honoured at the Oscars Ceremony in Hollywood. The film will be followed by a discussion.

- Film Club: Pedro Almodovar: Welcome to our own movie house, with popcorn and soda, where we spend a wonderful evening watching a Spanish movie with Spanish subtitles, by this famous director from La Mancha who has won many prestigious awards such as the Oscars. The film will be followed by a discussion.
- Tapas Tour: Guided tour of Spanish and Andalusian cuisine. We visit the oldest bodega in Malaga to learn about the famous Malaga sweet wine, which we will taste as an aperitif before moving onto a tapas bar in the historic centre of Malaga where we will sample typical Spanish tapas, which cater for every taste - vegetables, meat and fish, drinks included. After the tapas, the most adventurous will round up the night in a nightclub for a dance and a drink.
- Flamenco Dance Lessons: Sevillanas: The Sevillana, the popular Andalusian dance, is performed at special events such as fairs, pilgrimages, etc. These are practical classes where students will learn, step-by-step, this traditional flamenco-style Andalusian dance. Very entertaining.
- Latin dance Lessons: Salsa: Practical and fun classes to learn the dances that come from across the Atlantic. Salsa, merengue, bachata, rueda cubana... Dance away!
- Tetería; Belly Dancing: Under the moonlight which filters through the tea room Andalusian-style courtyard, the music and languid movements of the dancer's veils will transport you to the distant shores of the East.
- Cocktail Workshop: As if we were Tom Cruise in his famous movie, we learn how to mix unusual cocktails and drinks. With or without alcohol, it's up to you.
- Karaoke: join us for a karaoke at our private function and sing Spanish and English songs from different eras and styles.
- Flamenco Show: Flamenco show at a typical venue in Malaga, with tapas tasting, and one drink included.

- Picasso's Birth-house Museum: Guided tour of the Picasso family home in Malaga located in Plaza de la Merced, where we see objects belonging to the family and his father, José Ruiz Blasco, who had a great influence on the Malagan painter's early years, as well as some minor works by the artist such as lithographs and ceramics.
- Picasso Museum: Educational visit of the museum dedicated to the great Malaga painter, where we can enjoy a total of 150 works from different periods exhibited in two large rooms. There is a video in English, with Spanish subtitles, of the life and work of the painter. The museum also hosts an exhibition of archaeological remains discovered during the excavations of the XVI century palace where it is located.
- Visit to the Central Market: Markets are the heart of any city in the world. Guided tour of the main city market, where we can admire, as if it were a museum, fruits, vegetables, fish, etc. Very different and striking.

The price of the activities varies: some of them are free (generally 2 free activities per week) and others are fee paying, with prices varying from 10 to 35 Euros approximately. Students can book the ones that interest them.

Excursions:

During the weekend, day excursions are organized in which students can visit Andalusian cities of great cultural importance, such as Granada, Seville, Cordoba and Ronda and also places like the British colony of Gibraltar, the snowy peaks of "Sierra Nevada" and the exotic country of Morocco. All these excursions are possible, in part, thanks to Malaga's central geographical location in Andalusia, and its excellent communications.

Some weekend trips are also organized to the prehistoric caves of Nerja and the picturesque towns around Malaga like Nerja, Frigiliana, Competa, Marbella, Mijas, Fuengirola, Torremolinos, Antequera or Benalmádena.

The price of the excursions is around 50 Euros, depending on the destination.

Attendance

Being present in the class is obligatory. Being consistent is fundamental to learn a language. Students will not be able to improve their level of Spanish if they don't attend all the lessons. Students will not receive the attendance certificate, if they are absent more than 2 times without valid reason.

Homework

Students will have homework. It is an important part of the programme, so they are asked to finish the homework they'll get from the teachers as otherwise they cannot follow the rhythm of the class and not only will they lose time, but they can also impair the progress of their classmates.

Use of Internet

The students can only use the Internet after the lessons. A student who hasn't attended lessons on a certain date is not allowed to use the Internet that day.

Library

In the school students will have access to a library with more than 400 books about the different aspects of the Spanish language and culture in Spain and Latin America. A large number of books are adapted to certain levels so students can ask their teacher which book suits their requirements and is easy to read.

Certificates

Every student who finishes their courses with Cervantes E.I. will receive an attendance certificate, on condition that they attend at least 80% of the course.

Only the hours when students attended their lessons will be noted on the certificate. Students will also receive a report card at the end of the course, showing their progress. Students who complete the annual course and finish the Advanced level at Cervantes E.I. will receive a study certificate and a letter indicating that they have a good command of the Spanish language.

Student Feedback

The last Thursday of the course, students will receive an evaluation sheet about their stay in our school, their accommodation, etc. They have to fill this out and return it to the secretary.
