(AGE 10-12)

Beginning at 9:00 a.m., you will have three hours of General English lessons in a group of no more than ten students. The first two hours will focus on the 4 main skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing as well as grammar and vocabulary. In the third hour students will be doing project work such as preparing a presentation or play.

In the afternoon most students join our social activities for an enjoyable local outing, such as visiting the Oxford Castle, games and picnics in the park, and ice skating. Social activities generally run from 1:30pm and are finished by 4:00pm.

(AGE 13 & 14)

Beginning at 9:30 you will have activities until 12:00 at which time you will have lunch. At 13:00 you will have lessons as above.

Located in the centre of Oxford, the students will find it is easily accessible from all bus routes however we can arrange transport to and from school, if required

BUSINESS FOUNDATION COURSE

This is a 7 month programme preparing students to study Business or Business related topics at University

There are 2 starting dates:

- October – if students need to improve their English level and will need to have an IELTS 5.0

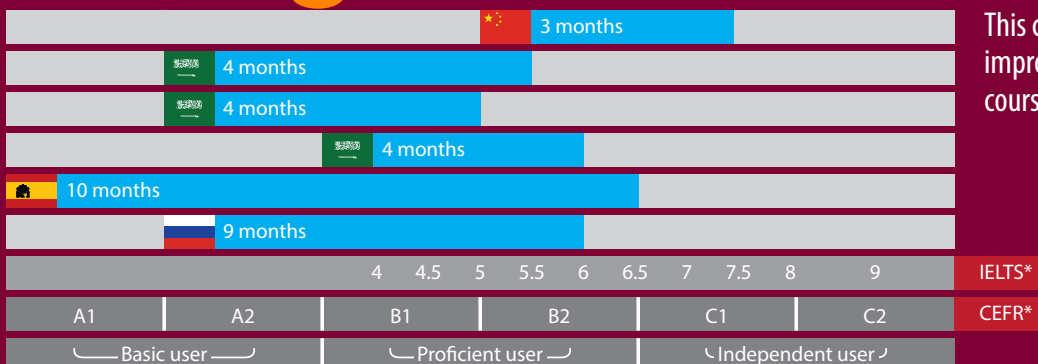

Accommodation

We consider your accommodation to be a very important part of your stay and we will make every effort to ensure that you are happy and comfortable throughout your time in Oxford.

Your Host Family

Most CIE students stay in host family accommodation. This provides you with the opportunity to share the daily life of a British family. All our families are British and speak English in the home and will help you practise your English outside of the classroom.

During your stay

You will have breakfast and dinner with the host family during the week and at the weekend all meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) will be provided.

Students of the same nationality will not be placed in the same host family unless you request to stay with a friend.

As CIE is situated in the centre of Oxford, an excellent bus service is available to and from the homes of all our host families.

CIE's accommodation officer inspects the homes of all host families regularly to ensure that they meet our standards as well as those of the British Council.

Our families

The United Kingdom is a multicultural nation with a diverse population, and our host families represent a variety of ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Our families mirror the United Kingdom as a whole and the various kinds of families that are found here. Some of our host families have two parents, and some are single-parent families. Some families have children living in the home, and others have no children. Some of our families are fairly young, and some are older and more mature.

Before you arrive

Before you arrive at CIE you will receive a profile of the host family who you will be staying with. We are always happy to help you with any questions regarding your host family accommodation.



Other Accommodation Choices

For students wishing to have greater independence, CIE can offer advice on accommodation in a guesthouse or hotel, or for long-term students, renting a flat or a private room. During University holidays, CIE is occasionally able to arrange residential accommodation in a University college for groups upon request (and for a higher fee than host family accommodation), See www.oxfordrooms.co.uk for more details

1 PRIVATE STUDY

After lessons, you are free to study on your own.

CIE's Bocardo House is a 5-minute walk from the Oxford City library, which is open seven days a week and offers free internet access as well as many other services for students. If you are in Oxford for 3 months or more, CIE can help you sign up for a library card, so you can borrow books and materials from the library.

At CIE we have computers with internet which you can use any time outside of lesson time. We also have a small library with books and texts written in English. You are welcome to borrow these books while you are a student at CIE by writing your name in the lending booklet.

2 SIGHTSEEING

Oxford is full of beautiful places to visit, allowing you and your classmates to take in the history and architectural beauty of this

medieval city. Visitors come from all over the world to experience the world famous Oxford University buildings, walks through the beautiful parks or even go punting on the River Thames.

3 EATING

If you've had enough of the sights, you can relax with a cup of tea or coffee and a pastry in a local café. Café culture is alive and well in Oxford, and in the city centre, a café is never more than a few minutes away.

This ancient city is full of beautiful places to visit and CIE is located in the heart of it all, allowing you and your classmates to take in the history and architectural beauty of this medieval city.

Oxford is a multi-cultural city which is reflected in the local cuisine. Why not try some Mexican food at Mission Burrito or go to Itsu for some Japanese? Alternatively try some traditional British pub food at one of the many pubs all around the city. If you're in a hurry, you can always grab something quick to take away from the many kebab vans or fish-and-chip shops!

4 SHOPPING

In Oxford there are shops for all different types of fashion; high-street stores, boutiques, delicatessens, craft shops and even antiques stalls. On Wednesdays and Thursdays you can visit the market. This is a favourite of our students and is only a 2 minute walk from CIE! At the weekend you can visit Bicester Village, just

a 25 minute bus ride from us where you can find many famous fashion brands. If you want to stay within the city centre, you will find lots of shopping to do in Cornmarket Street, Queen Street, or the lovely Covered Market.

5 AREA TRANSPORT

The Oxford Bus Company offers local buses, and also regular buses to London, home to some of the world's greatest shopping and dining! The convenient Oxford rail station is in the centre of town, near Oxford University's Said Business School. Getting to and from London is very easy, as there are direct fast trains very regularly which take approximately 1 hour and numerous coaches running every 5-10 minutes which take around 1 hour and 30 minutes.

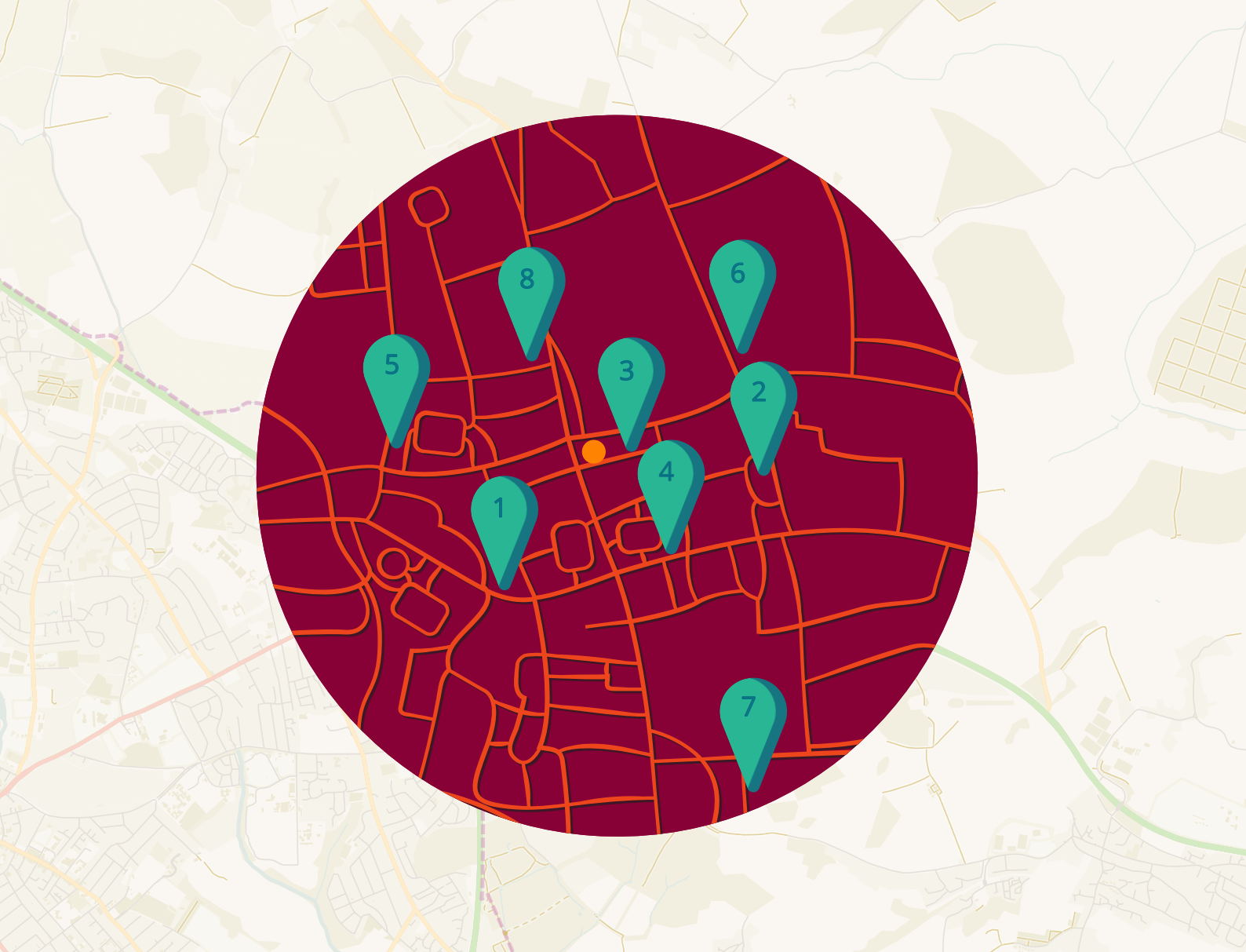
Stagecoach buses depart every half-hour to take you to fantastic brand-name outlet shopping at nearby Bicester Village.

6 PUBS & CLUBS

In the evenings, it is an English tradition for young people to enjoy an hour (or more!) in their local pub. Oxford has many "public houses" where you can enjoy a pint of beer and a chat with friends. After dark, the Oxford club scene comes to life. The city offers a range of nightclubs and music venues where you and your new friends can listen to live music being performed, or dance the night away.

7 SPORTS & THE OUTDOORS

No matter what the weather, most English people love to play sport and be outdoors. Perhaps



you'd like to play a game of football in University Parks, or take a long countryside walk through Port Meadow to the Perch Pub in Binsey. You can find many outdoors and sports opportunities in and around the city.

8 MUSEUMS, THEATRE, & MUSIC

Of course, you cannot visit Oxford without experiencing some of the cultural buildings in the city. You can pass time in the Ashmolean Museum on a rainy afternoon, watch an exciting matinee performance at the Oxford Playhouse, or spend a Sunday morning listening to live music at one of the Coffee Concerts. You will have countless chances to enjoy the stimulating environment in the city.

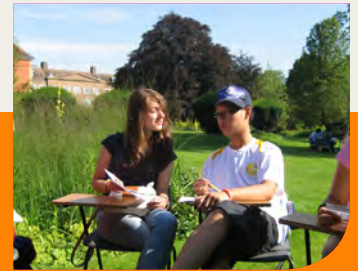
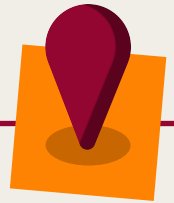

Lady Margaret Hall (LMH) (summer only)

At LMH we use between 15-25 classrooms, computer room, tennis courts, football pitches and large gardens. It is one of the most beautiful campuses of all the Oxford colleges. It is situated in the northern part of the city surrounded by the University Parks, the River Cherwell, and nature areas.



Wesley Methodist Church
