<p>The Cathedral was constructed by the order of the Russian emperor Alexander III in order to memorize the deeds and reforms of his father Alexander II who was assassinated in 1881. This is the only cathedral in St. Petersburg that is decorated in the Russian style.</p> <p>Price: 500 Rub</p>	<p>We will teach you how to cook pelmeni. In 1765 she gave her favourite, Count Grigory Orlov, a lavish gift – the Gatchina estate. The design for the palace was developed by the Italian architect Antonio Rinaldi.
