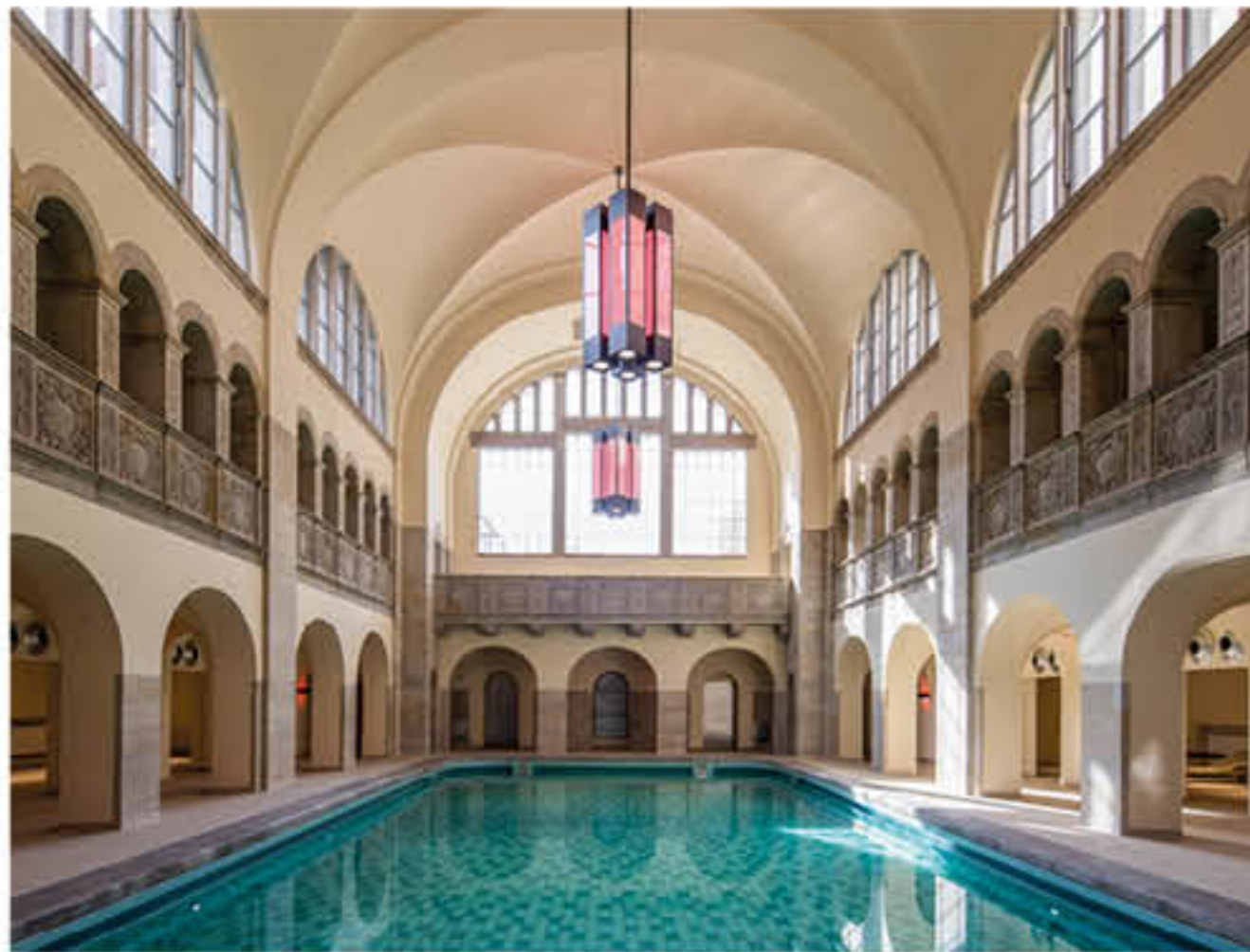


Überreste der Berliner Mauer
Remains of the Berlin Wall

Die Berliner Mauer galt weltweit als Symbol der Teilung Deutschlands nach dem Zweiten Weltkrieg und darüber hinaus als Symbol des Unrechts und der Unmenschlichkeit des kommunistischen Systems.

The Berlin Wall was a worldwide symbol for the division of Germany after World War II and for the injustice and inhumanity of the communist system.

Construction began on August 13, 1961, on the orders of the GDR leadership. It formed a 150 kilometer long barrier sealing off East Berlin and East Germany from West Berlin, Moscow, and the rest of the world.



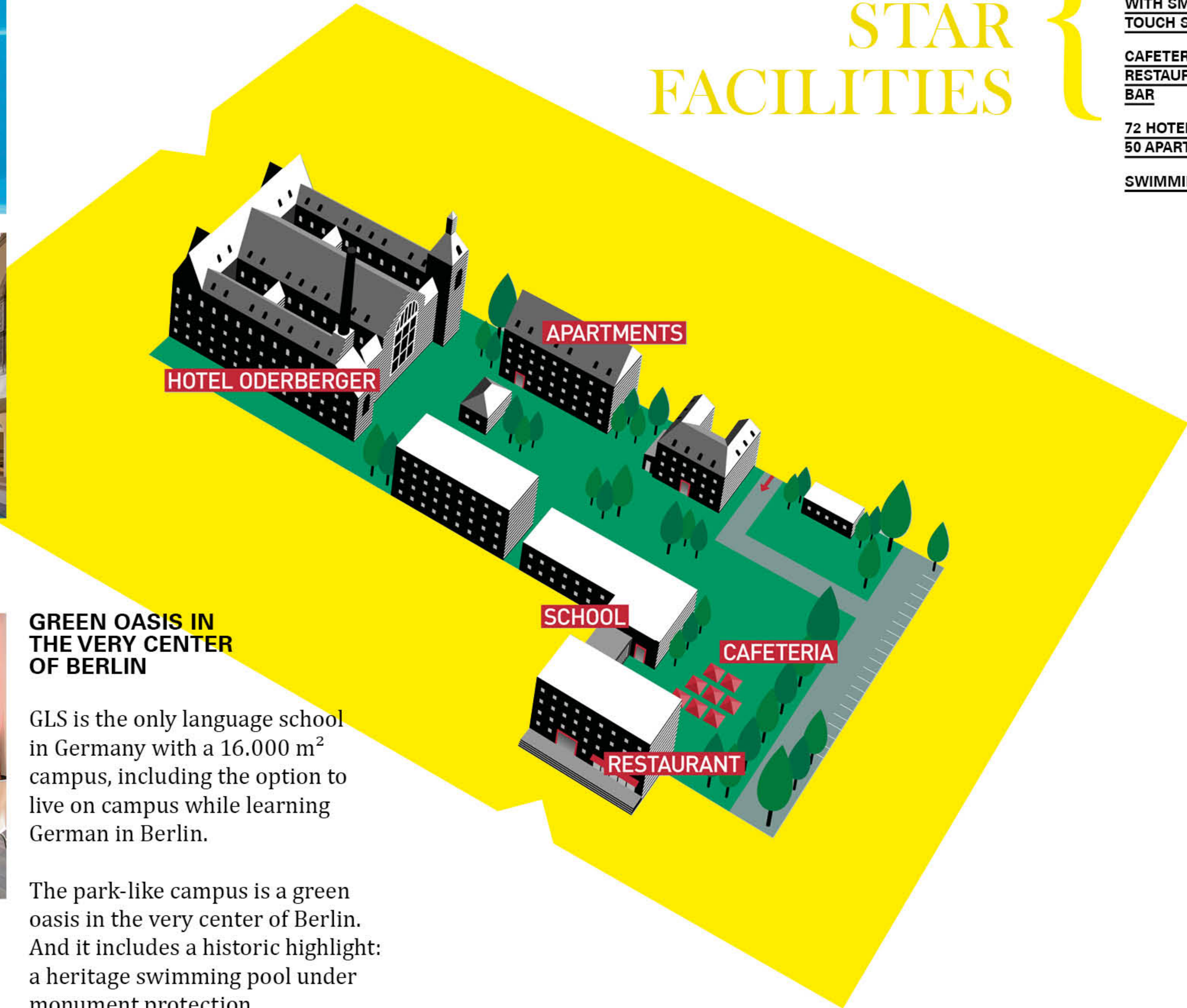

GREEN OASIS IN THE VERY CENTER OF BERLIN

THE GLS CAMPUS REFLECTS BERLIN'S HISTORY.

THE HOTEL

is the jewel of the campus, a Berlin landmark under monument protection. Built in 1902 as a public bath house, it was closed down in 1986 due to damages in the basin.

In 2011 GLS renovated the dilapidated building, re-opening it as Hotel Oderberger (see page 040).

METHOD & LEVELS

METHODS & LEVELS

METHOD

GLS uses the communicative approach: German is the only language spoken in class.

Teachers act as facilitators, encouraging students to speak German as much as possible. Students get all the corrections, grammar and vocabulary they need to take them to the next level, but the priority is on active speaking.

GLS teaches in tandem, i.e. 2 teachers tutor 1 class and alternate at every break.

LEVELS

We teach German at all levels ranging from beginners to advanced (levels as defined by the Common European Reference Framework):

- A = elementary
- B = intermediate
- C = advanced

PLACEMENT TEST

For immediate assessment of a student's level GLS provides a free online test (on www.gls-berlin.de).

When students arrive in Berlin, a placement test consisting of a written and an oral part ensures they will share a class with others of a similar level.

PROGRESS CHECK

A written evaluation test every Friday (duration: 20 minutes) allows students to check their progress. In addition, personalized feedback from teachers is available at any time.

TELC OR GOETHE – WHAT IS BETTER?

There are no significant differences. Both – Goethe and telc – are recognized testing bodies, so simply take the exam that suits you best in terms of testing dates and prices.

IS TELC C1 HOCHSCHULE A VALID ALTERNATIVE TO TESTDAF?

Yes. In 2016 the certificate telc Deutsch C1 Hochschule was officially recognized as proof of the level of German needed to matriculate at a university in Germany.

TELC C1 HOCHSCHULE AND TESTDAF – WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

- TestDaF has only six testing dates per year, while you can do a telc C1 Hochschule exam every month.
- Exam fees are a bit lower for telc C1 Hochschule than for TestDaF.
- Results for telc C1 Hochschule are issued faster than those for TestDaF.

UNIVERSITY PATHWAY GERMANY

German universities offer excellent study opportunities to students from all over the world. The fees they charge are very low compared to those in many other countries. Getting access, however, can be a challenging process. And that's where the GLS pathway program comes in:

THE PROGRAM

1. Application Service for Universities in Germany.
2. Preparatory German courses enabling students to obtain the required German language certificate.

GLS supports applications for BA and MA programs at nearly 800 German universities in all areas

Free checking of a student's documents prior to arrival to determine eligibility

Free roadmap to university, customized to a student's academic background

THERE ARE TWO PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY IN GERMANY:

Which of the two applies depends on your academic background. Direct access to university is possible if your academic background is accepted as equivalent to a German high school diploma. If not, indirect access is your option: You will have to do a foundation year – aka Studienkolleg – prior to enrollment at university. The Studienkolleg is free, but you will need to pass an entrance and a final exam.

GLS arranges between 60 – 90 internships every year and offers a free coaching session for future interns.

AS MANY GERMAN PROFESSIONALS SPEAK ENGLISH – WHY IS GERMAN AT LEVEL B1 A PREREQUISITE?

Companies simply insist on it and there are many reasons for that – like PC programs or keyboards labelled in German. Not everybody in Germany is fluent in English, and an intern who can communicate effectively in German is more valuable to them.

HOW DO YOU FIND COMPANIES FOR INTERNATIONAL INTERNS?

GLS does inhouse language training for lots of companies and institutions in Berlin, so we know their Human Resources departments quite well.

CAN YOU GUARANTEE AN INTERNSHIP?

Yes, we can – we check every application, and if we accept and confirm it, students can be sure to be placed in a Berlin company. They won't get the position immediately, as the companies insist on a personal interview, but that is no problem: our coaching sessions make sure that the interview is successful.

WILL INTERNS GET A LETTER OF REFERENCE?

Yes, of course. They will get a «Praktikumszeugnis», i.e. a letter of reference from their Berlin host company.

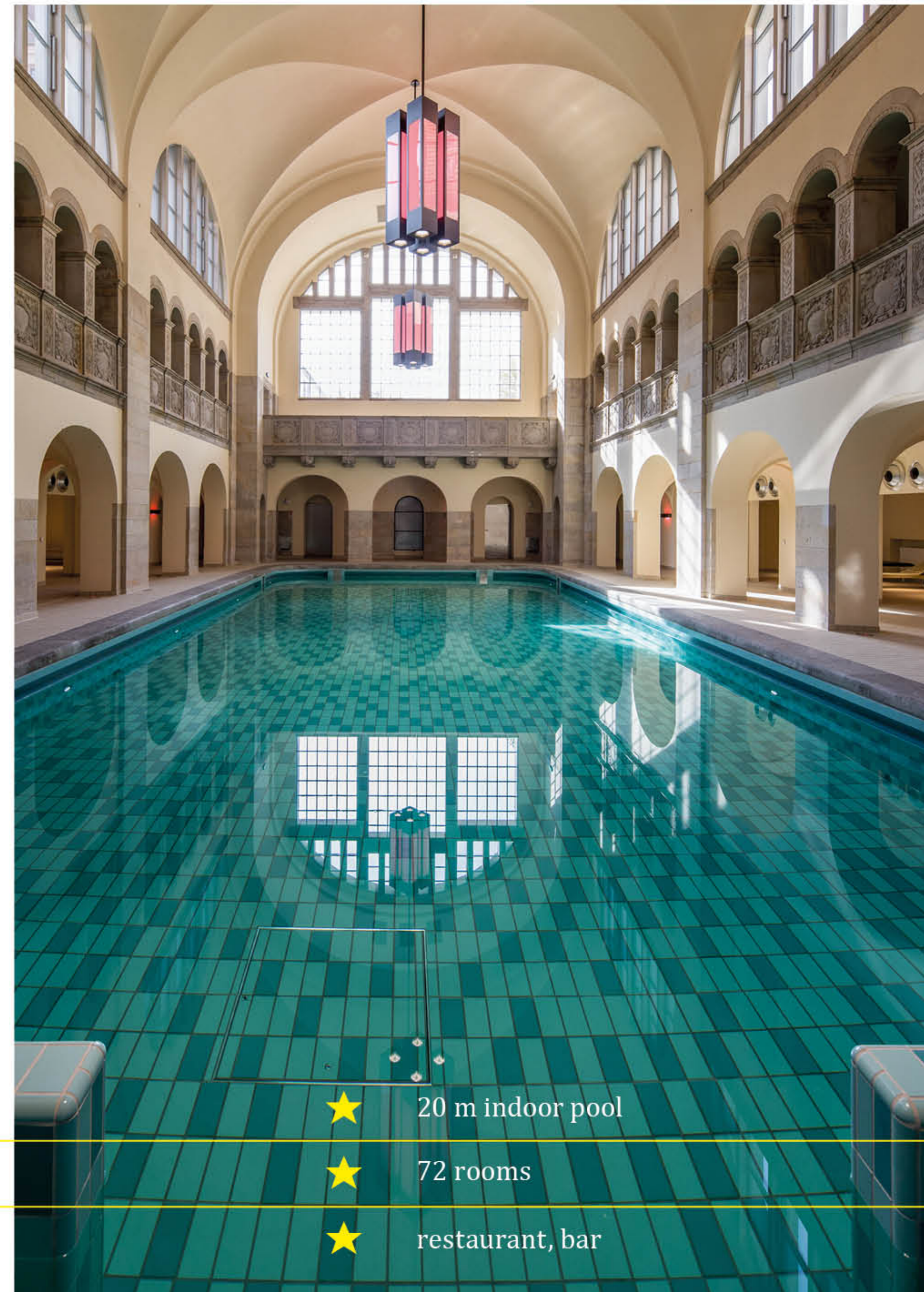
The hotel is the most spectacular building on campus: a Berlin landmark under monument protection.

The Oderberger was built in 1902 as a public bath house – with a grand cathedral-like swim hall. The historic pool is open on average 5 days per week. The hotel rooms in the wings flanking the hall are stylish and modern, but the historic flair lingers on, in carefully restored design details in the decor.
