# **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

#### ENROLLMENT and PLACEMENT

Upon registration, new students do an oral and written assessment test in order to be placed in an ESL class which corresponds to their level of English. Each session is in two parts which lasts for 8 weeks. Students who obtain a letter grade of B (70%) or higher will be able to move on to the next level. Most students enroll for 4-6 session (16-24weeks). After passing upper intermediate level 6, students are eligible to apply for the specialized programs (diploma courses).



#### **COURSE OUTCOME**

This course is designed to dramatically improve students' natural speaking style. Fluency is the goal for students who take this course. This will be accomplished by using quick-response activities to build up students' speed (fluency) and extensive one-on-one teacher-student feedback to build accuracy.

#### PERIOD DESCRIPTION

#### PERIOD 1:

The opening period will have students reviewing weekly video journals, as well as sound recordings of themselves mimicing and imitating a native English speaker. The second half of first period will have in one pronunciation, understanding how to improve speech clarity and accuracy.

#### PERIOD 2:



# **English for Medicine**

The Medical English Program is designed for medical professionals, healthcare workers and University / College students of medicine. Students will develop the Language skills required to work in English-speaking medical settings. The program is intended to improve student's communication skills that are needed to work with colleagues, patients and their families in an effective and safe manner. We offer sessions on a wide range of topics including specific medical terminology and vocabulary, reading and writing medical conferences, seminars, and presentations delivered in English. Students also receive a weekly seminar with a registered nurse. Students are expected to complete 200 hours of in-class training and received a diploma upon completion of the eight-weeks program. Successful candidates can go on to an optional four-weeks observation session offered at a healthcare facility to gain hands-on experience.

#### **BUSINESS COMMUNICATION**

Business Communication Plays an important part of this course. Each student will compile a body of written work in a portfolio. Each student is also assigned to research a country of his/her choice in a comprehensive project on business in a global setting, with emphasis on business and communication without borders. The students will also give oral presentations based on their written reports.
