STEP 1 - CHOOSING YOUR COURSE

Your first step to joining the Linguaviva Centre is choosing the course that best fits your goals. STEP 3 - PLACEMENT TEST

Once your course has been booked and you have received your confirmation documents, you will take an online written Placement Test including a Spoken part via Zoom/WhatsApp Video. This will allow us to place you in the correct class level BEFORE you arrive in Dublin.

STEP 5 - FIRST DAY

Your first day will start with an Orientation session in the Viva Cafe, where you will receive information about your classes, your book, activity programme, useful information and Apps for navigating Dublin and much more.

STEP 7 - ACTIVITY PROGRAMME

We encourage all our students to actively participate in our Social Activity Programme. This will help you learn English in context by visiting Dublin's best museums and tourist attractions. Some of our activities will be held in-house and have a linguistic focus with fun elements.

STEP 9 - END OF COURSE CERTIFICATE

Upon completion of your course you will receive a CEFR linked End of Course Certificate. We will also ask you for feedback based on your Linguaviva experience. If you choose to return to our school in the future you will receive a 10% discount.

STEP 2 - BOOKING YOUR COURSE

The booking process starts with you filling out a booking form which will allow us to help you with any accommodation and airport transfer needs you may have. A booking deposit is paid at this stage.

STEP 4 - PRECOURSE INFORMATION

The week before your arrival, you will receive all the information for your first day of school, your timetable, student handbook and accommodation + transfer details where appropriate.

STEP 6 - CLASSES AND METHODOLOGY

Your classes will have a communicative approach so the focus will be on speaking and listening skills. Your classmates will come from different countries and you will have the chance to make friendships that will last a lifetime. Your progress will be monitored and you will be encouraged and helped to progress in your linguistic goals.

STEP 8 - PROGRESS

ENGLISH FOR COMMUNICATION

This premium course is aimed at learners who come to Ireland for a more intense period of study and want to maximise their progress, while still allowing them time to explore Dublin on our weekly activity and excursion programmes. In addition to our standard General English course, learners will take an extra 9 hours per week. This gives them the time to fully activate their English, collaborate and communicate using their 21st century skills. The projects will focus on universal themes and real-life skills allowing learners to draw on their own experience and that of their fellow classmates. The content on this course is introduced through video presentations, podcasts, blogs etc and allows students to bring their own backgrounds and expertise to the group and develop their learning skills through collaboration.

GENERAL ENGLISH WITH IELTS

IELTS is the most **well recognised exam** for those who want to study through English at university or college (or pursue a career path using English). This course combines General English in the morning (at B2 level or higher) with 5 hours per week of IELTS preparation. The skills used in this class are comparable to the linguistic, academic and cultural skills needed in Further or Higher Education. The IELTS module can be taken either in combination with General English or as a stand-alone course over **two afternoons per week**. Students on this course will have a structured syllabus to bring them from a 5.5 to a 6.5 or a 6.5 to a 7.5 in IELTS. Students follow the **Mindset for IELTS** series and additionally have access to a dedicated IELTS preparation online platform which will allow them easy access to study many additional hours leading up to their exams. The student and their tutor will use informative data which will indicate how the student is performing in each of the **four sub skills of IELTS**. The student will know exactly what they need to do in order to achieve their target score. Added to that, our academic team (who are experienced examiners) offer tutorials to maximise students performance in the IELTS exam and offer help with booking and taking the test. Over 12 weeks this course represents an **excellent means of achieving your target IELTS score**.

ACADEMIC YEAR PROGRAMMES

The Academic Year (AY) Programme, for NON-EU students, is a life-defining experience. The course is a six-month period of study which grants an eight month visa (GNIB Stamp 2). Students on this programme can work part-time (20h per week) and full-time (40h per week during June to September inclusive and from 15th December to 15th January) whilst living in Ireland and can choose morning or afternoon classes to suit their timetable. The Linguaviva Centre provides all the help and support you need from visa application to work preparation and interview. There are different requirements for Stamp 2 applications based on the nationality of the candidate, please, check with our enrolment team for further details.



TIE - END OF COURSE EXAM

All students registered on the Academic Year programmes are prepared for and take the Test of Interactive English (TIE) exam at the end of their 6-month course. TIE is a student-centred exam which focuses on the oral and written production of English. It fits in perfectly with our communicative teaching approach.

TRINITY CERT TESOL

The Trinity Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (CertTESOL) is a TESOL or TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) certificate designed for people with little or no experience of teaching English, and for those with experience who require an internationally recognised initial teacher education qualification. Preparing for the Trinity CertTESOL English language teaching certificate equips trainees with the basic skills and knowledge needed to take up their first post as an ESOL teacher. It gives an introduction to the theory and practice of English teaching and an insight into the challenges facing the learner and the role of the teacher. The CertTESOL is rated at Level 5 on Ofqual's Regulated Qualifications Framework, a comparable level to the second year of an undergraduate degree. In Ireland it is seen as a post graduate (Level 8) Special Award.

IN-SERVICE TEACHER TRAINING

The Linguaviva Centre is a validated Course Provider for Trinity Cert TESOL. We have a dedicated Teacher Training team which also offers **Erasmus +** Courses for Overseas Teachers. We offer a full-time two-week course in **CLIL & Communication Skills** along with a **Irish Culture, History & Literature** course which are both very popular. The intensive course format includes both workshops and lectures. We use a **'Reflective Journal'** to gather teaching materials which participants can use once they return to their schools. Teachers also get the opportunity to **team teach** and give/receive feedback from their peers and tutors on how to make their classes even more communicative and effective. Teachers who have taken these courses recently are German, Polish, Czech, French, Spanish and Italian, as well as Russian and South American.



CLIL & COMMUNICATION SKILLS

This option will allow you to immerse yourself in communicative language teaching and CLIL. You will spend your mornings in input sessions (lectures + workshops) and your afternoons exploring the city with professionally guided tours. You can expect to return home with many new ideas and practical material to implement in your own classrooms.

The Linguaviva Social Club offers you the opportunity to experience firsthand the Spirit of Dublin. It is fair to say that students who come to Dublin all testify to the fact that there is something unique and intangible about our city. Possibly because of its small size and young population or the fact that the city centre is so easy to navigate on foot, students feel safe and inspired in equal measure. At The Linguaviva Centre (TLC) we want students to enjoy Dublin to the full. Therefore we have created a multi-strand social program aimed at providing activities suitable for all our students.

1 - HALF DAY & FULL DAY TOURS

Friday afternoon at TLC there are no classes so we invite all our students to take a half day tour from 1pm starting at the Linguaviva Centre. We explore the coastal towns to the north and south of Dublin or take a must see visit to The Guinness Factory or Teelings Distillery. On Saturdays we offer full day tours to places of World Heritage significance like The Giant's Causeway or The Cliffs of Moher or Glendalough (an hour to the south of Dublin). Ireland is a small island which means you can be in the west of Ireland in a totally different landscape in a matter of a few hours.



3 - ACADEMIC TUTORIALS

Each week we have academic tutorials which are for students who want to do extra classes free of charge. The most popular include Pronunciation Masterclasses and Speaking Club.

THE POINT RESIDENCE****



Type of Accommodation
En-suite SINGLE SELF-CATERING rooms suitable for students, minimum age 18, arranged in cluster apartments of 8 rooms.

Rooms
Each room has a small double bed, large study desk, smart TV, drawers and hanging space.

Bathrooms
En-suite bathroom.

Kitchen / Meals
Each apartment has a shared kitchen with oven, hob, fridge/freezer, microwave, toaster, kettle, utensils, cutlery, crockery, glasses, and the living area includes dining table, chairs, sofa and a coffee table.

Facilities
Gym, fitness studio, study areas, basketball court, laundry, cinema, cafes, outdoor seating and roof terrace.

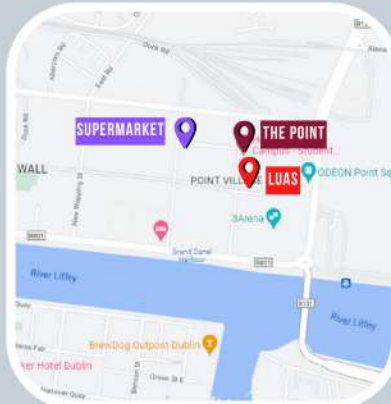
Utilities / Internet
Wi-Fi, electricity, gas and water included.

Laundry / Cleaning
Bed linen is provided. Students are responsible for cleaning their own rooms and washing their bed linen. Towels are not provided.

Travel Time
About a 35-minute walk or use LUAS+Bus to Linguaviva Centre.



Stylish, newly built student residence, with excellent facilities, in Point Village, in the heart of Dublin's bustling Docklands area about 35 minutes walk to Linguaviva Centre. The LUAS line and several bus routes are also nearby.

Type of Accommodation
Twin Rooms some en-suite some share a bathroom. Limited possibility of booking a twin for single use. Minimum age 18.

Rooms
All rooms have a single bed per person as well as storage facilities for clothes.

Bathrooms
A mix of shared, en-suite depending on room.

Kitchen / Meals
There is a shared kitchen with cupboards and fridges for storing food. The kitchen is equipped with an oven, hob, toasters, kettles, microwave and utensils.

Facilities
Shared living room with sofas and smart TV. There is WiFi throughout the building and a washer/dryer for laundry.

Utilities / Internet
Wi-Fi, electricity, and water included.

Laundry / Cleaning
Bed linen is provided. Students are responsible for cleaning their own rooms and washing their bed linen. Towels are not provided.

Travel Time
3 minutes walk to our school, located 210 metres away.

Security / Keys
There is an on-site Residence Manager and students are given a key to the building.

Damage
Students must pay for any damage caused.

Arrival / Departure
Saturday or Sunday ONLY

Noise Restrictions
We ask that students respect fellow guests and keep noise to a minimum after 10 p.m.

Check-in / Check-out
Check in from 3:00 pm, check out 10:00 am.

Notice / Cancellation
If you want to cancel your accommodation before arrival in Ireland, you must give notice in writing. We will refund all fees minus a €200 cancellation fee unless the accommodation fees for the notice period exceed that amount. If so you will be charged €200 plus the difference.
Residential Accommodation = **4 weeks notice period**

Security Deposit
All students are required to pay a **security deposit of 200€** on the first day of their course. Please see our Enrolment Details for Terms and Conditions of said deposit.



HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION



Type of Accommodation

Home stays are ideal for students who are under 18 years of age as well as those adults who are in Dublin for a short period of time and are looking to maximise their 'Irish Cultural experience.

Rooms

Single rooms are usually the most requested. Some homestays also provide twin and double rooms for students looking to share.

Bathrooms

En-suite bathrooms are available with some homestays for an extra charge, subject to availability

Meals

Homestays can be booked with Half (HB) or Full Board (FB) options.

HB = breakfast + dinner on weekdays with light lunch on the weekends.

FB = breakfast + packed lunch + dinner every day.

Special Diets

A limited number of hosts are able to cater for Vegetarian, Vegan, Gluten Free, Lactose Intolerant diets. This is subject to availability, and for an additional supplement.

Laundry / Cleaning

Bed linen and towels are provided. Students are responsible for keeping their own room tidy. The family will usually do one load of laundry per week for the student.

Summer Supplement

€30/week between 1/7 and 31/8

Travel Time / Cost

Host families are usually between 25-50 minutes from the school by public transport.

Keys

Hosts will usually supply the student with a set of keys.

Damage

Students must pay for any damage caused.

Arrival / Departure

Check in times are pre-arranged with the host based on flight and transfer times. It is not always possible to arrive between 23.00 and 6.00. Please check with the enrolment office before booking your flights.

Check-in / Check-out

Check-in and check-out must be on a Saturday or Sunday. Extra night supplement will be charged where applicable.

Utilities / Internet

Wi-Fi, electricity, gas and water included.

Notice / Cancellation

If you want to cancel your accommodation before arrival in Ireland, you must give notice in writing. *We will refund all fees minus a €200 cancellation fee unless the accommodation fees for the notice period exceed that amount. If so you will be charged €200 plus the difference.

*Homestay Accommodation = 3 weeks notice period



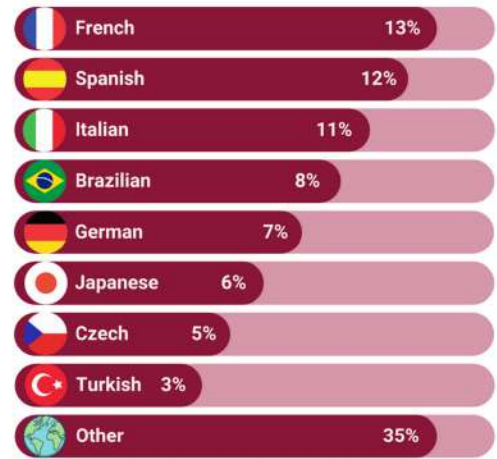
The highest standard of host family accommodation is available to all Linguaviva students. Families are very carefully selected. All accommodation is inspected and monitored on an ongoing basis by our Accommodation Officer. Host families are situated in some of the best residential areas of Dublin. Staying in an Irish home ensures total immersion in the language. Students feel at home in the warm, friendly atmosphere of Irish family life and many lasting friendships are made between the student and host family. All our families are based on the South side of Dublin.

Please note that all families are different and this info sheet is for guidance purposes only. Students must follow their host family rules at all times during their stay.
